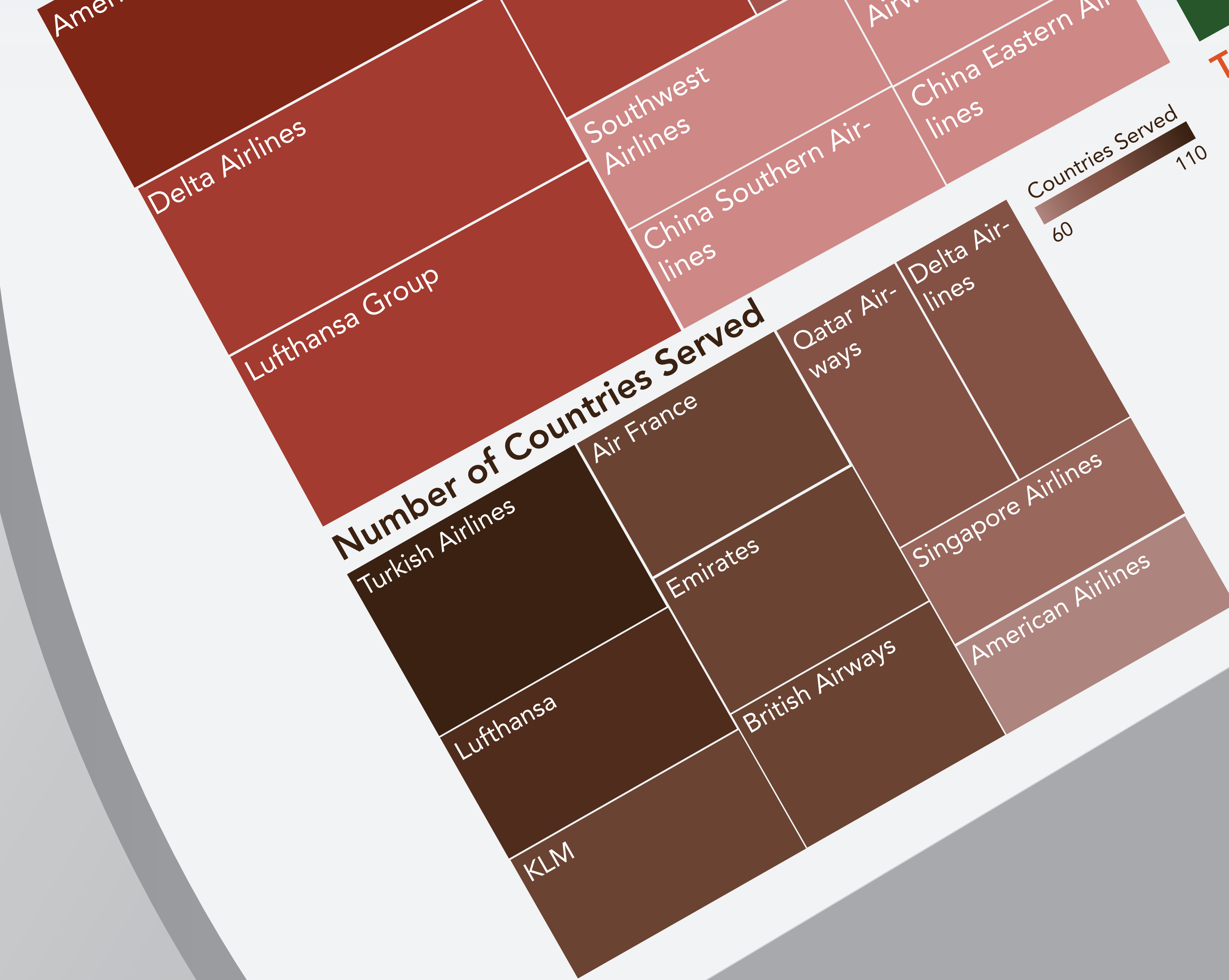


World's Largest Airlines

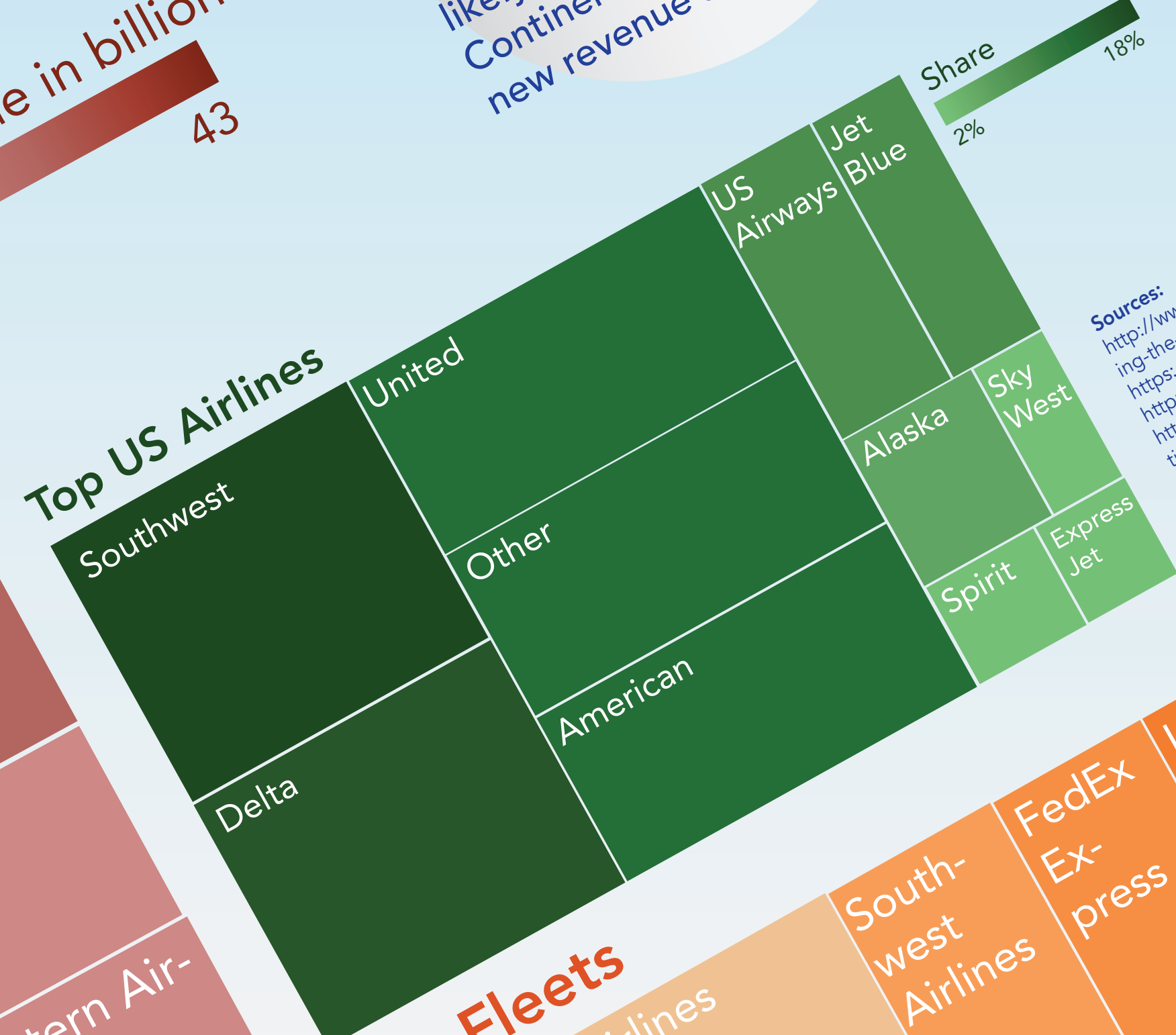
US Airways (LCC) and America West merged, so did Delta (DAL) and Northwest. Southwest (LUV) and AirTran, and Air France and Delta have expressed interest in each other while independently eyeing American Airlines, now in Chapter 11.

All this amalgamating may be a good thing for the air lines. It could bring order and discipline to an industry that since its deregulation in 1978 has been prone to destabilizing price wars and chronic overexpansion. (It's also likely to raise fares, at least on some routes.) In buying Continental, United promised Wall Street \$1.2 billion in new revenue and cost savings.

Top US Airlines

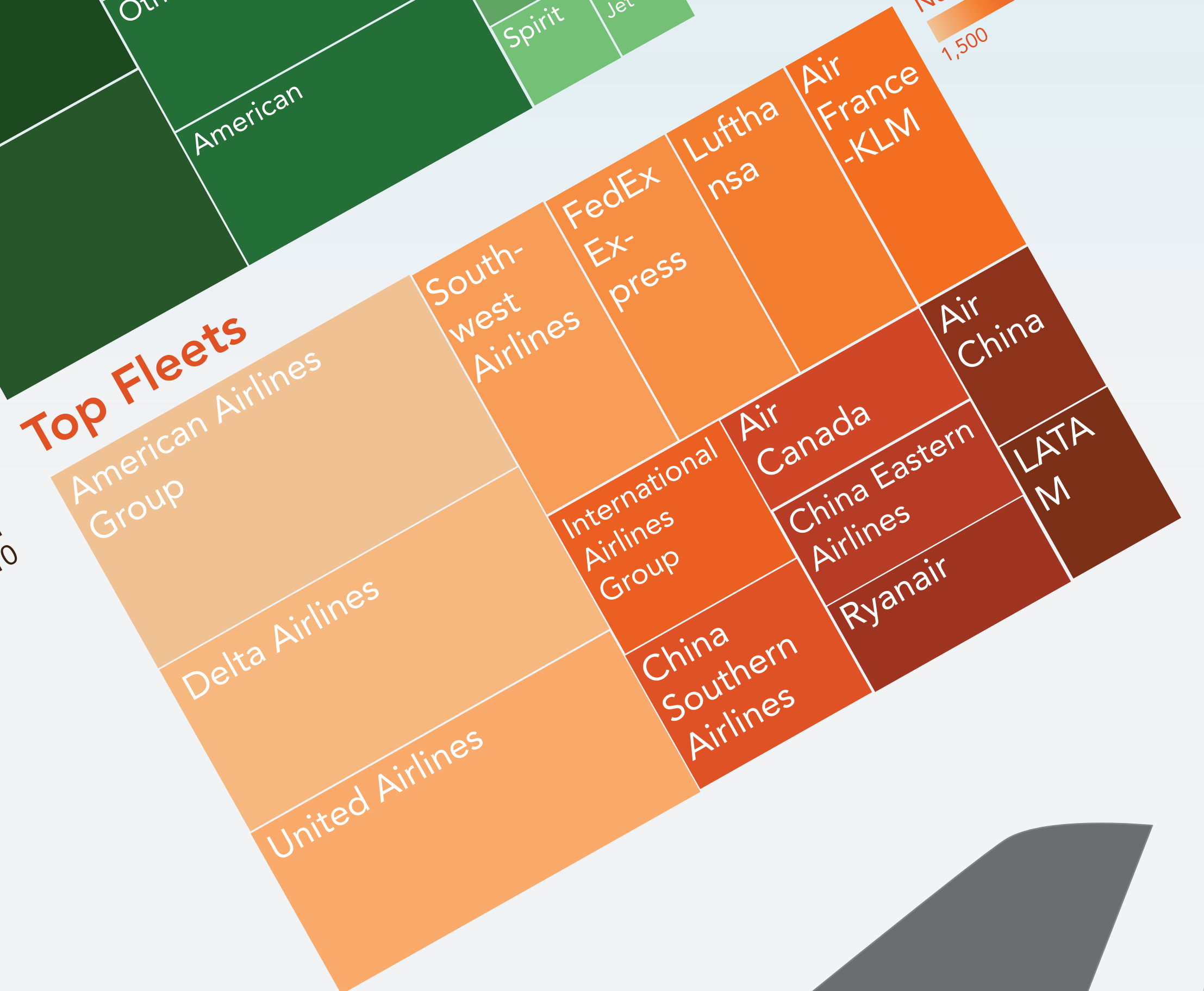
