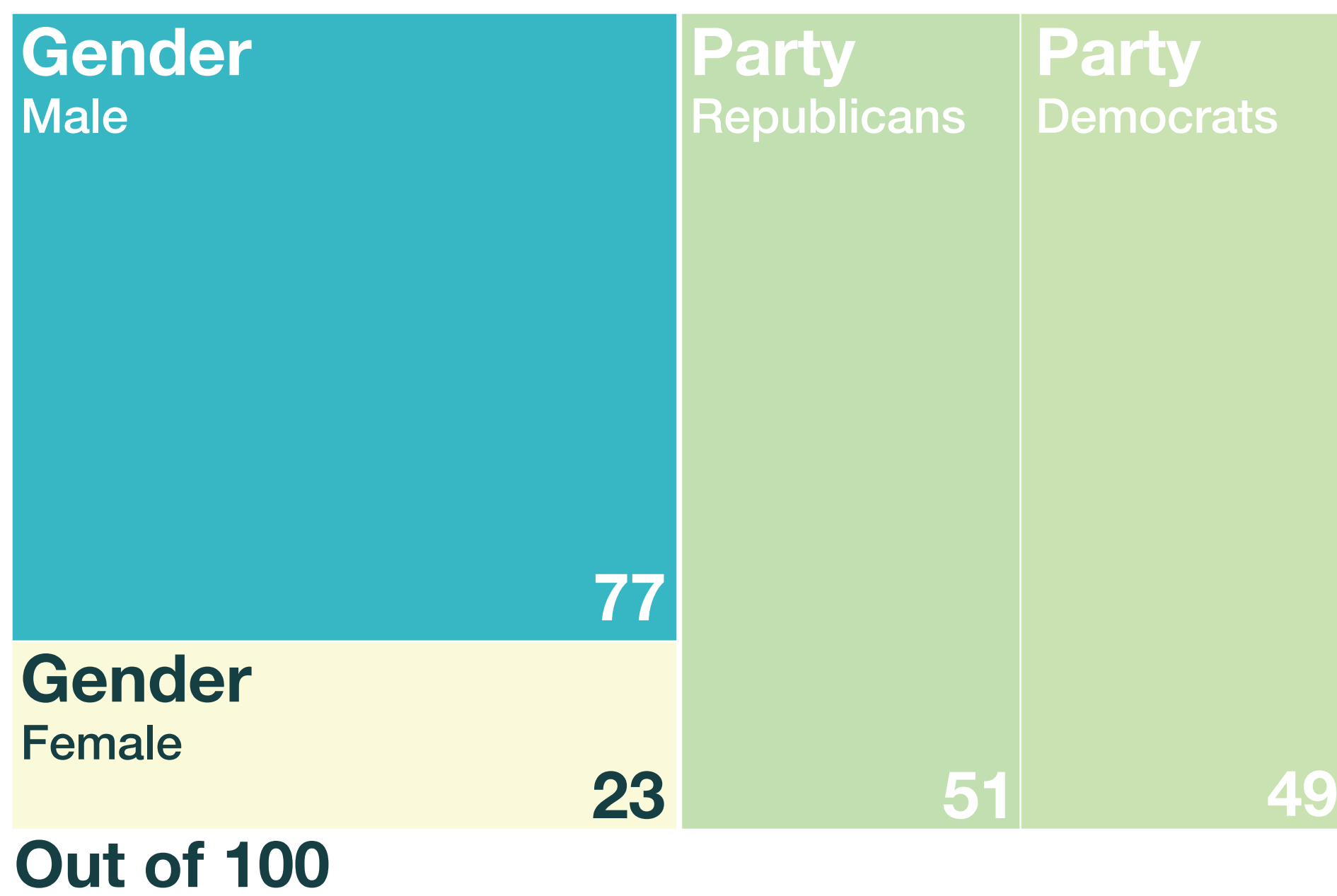


2018 Women in U.S. Congress

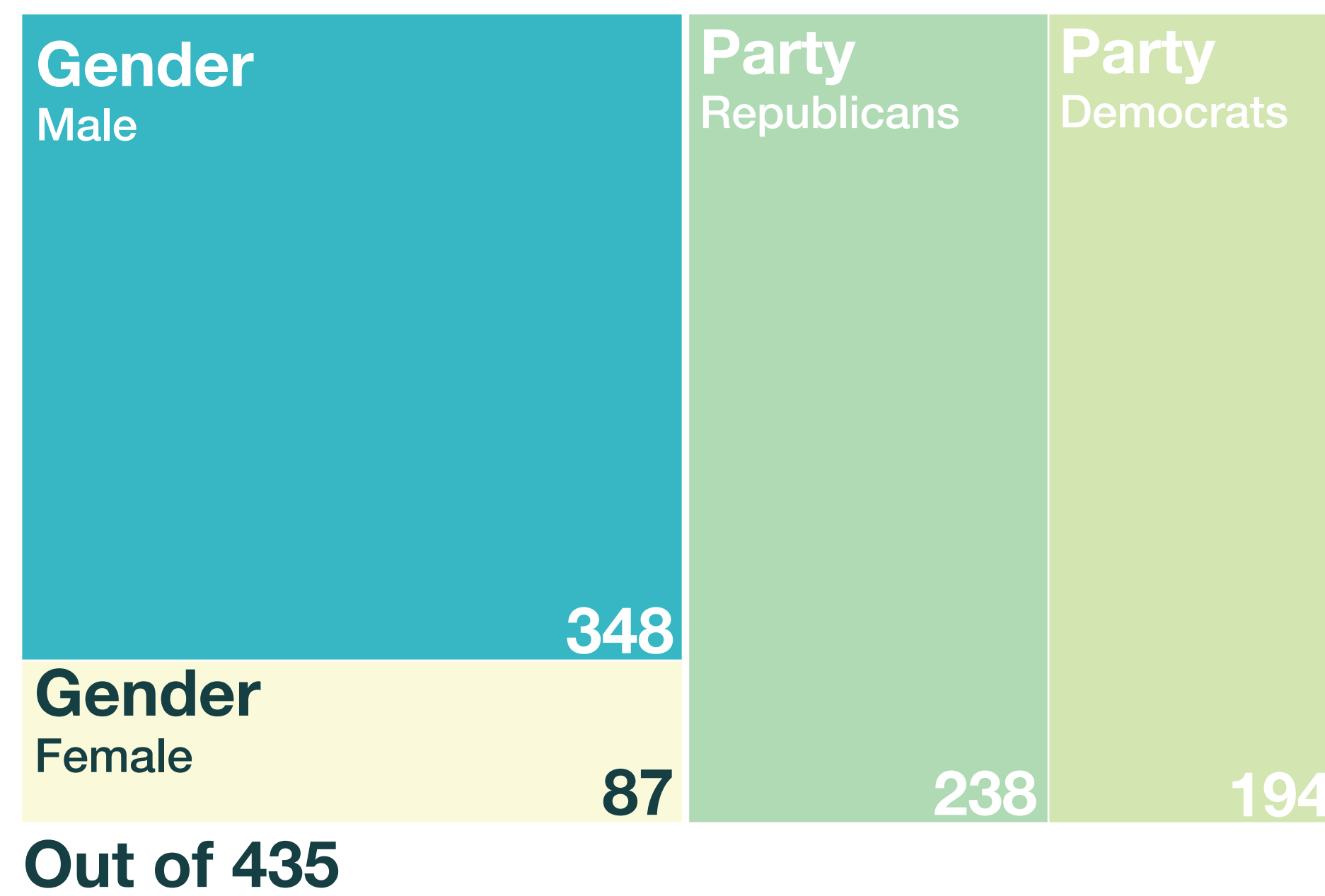
Midterm Election

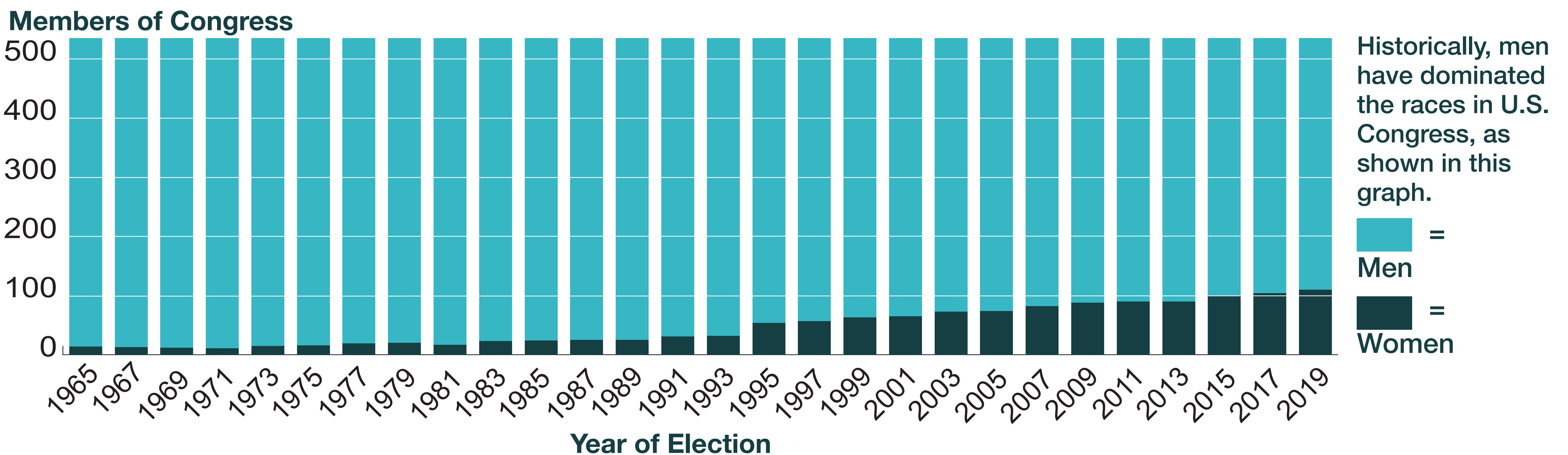
House of Representatives

According to the Rutgers University Center for American Women and Politics, this Congress features a record of women of color, and a record number of non-incumbent women.

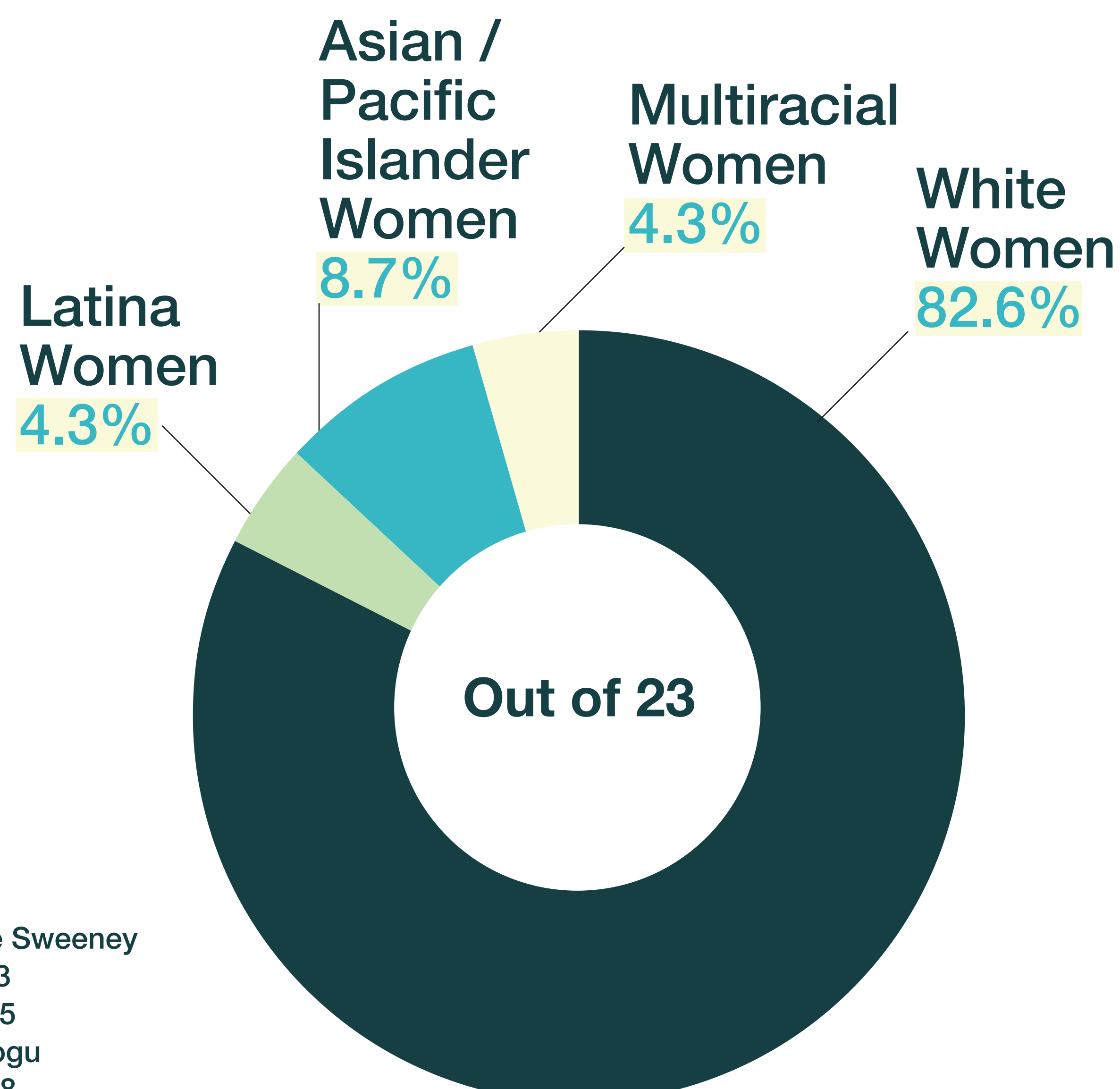
History of Women in the U.S. Congress
